

April 2008 Weather Summary

April was looking at above normal temperatures in the first few weeks of the month but an arctic cold front swept down by mid-month bringing new record minimum temperatures to all of the weather stations in the BC Peace region and north along the highway. The cold air from the arctic continued to keep minimum temperatures low but daytime maximums began to recover by months end. Precipitation was near to slightly above normal for the north east while to the east Grande Prairie saw double normal amounts.

The outlook for May is for continuing below normal temperatures for the province except for the Fort Nelson area which is looking for near normal temperatures.
