

# February 2007 Weather Summary

Report based on Dawson Creek Airport Data

**March** 2007 saw temperatures in the far north running five degrees below normal for the month but as you approach the Peace River climate region they began to moderate a little. While still remaining below normal the temperatures warmed to four degrees below normal in Fort St. John and Chetwynd to 3 degrees below normal in Dawson Creek. The return to normal March temperatures occurred in the area just north of Prince George. The snowfall in Fort St John and Chetwynd was nearly double the normal for the month which also gave a water equivalent of nearly double for March. The total precipitation for 2007 so far is 50% higher than normal for Fort St John and 10% higher for Chetwynd.

## Temperatures

- Average daily high of -2.1 was below the normal of 0.9 degrees C.
- Average daily low of -13.0 was below the normal of -10.6 degrees C.
- Mean temperature of -7.6 was below the normal of -4.9 degrees C.
- Monthly high temperature 8.5 degrees Celsius on the 23<sup>rd</sup>.
- Monthly low temperature -29.2 degrees Celsius on the 2<sup>nd</sup>.
