

## July 2008 Weather Summary

Northeastern BC weather was dominated in July by rainfall, either too much or too little. Only the far north east at Fort Nelson saw too much rain with 123.7 mm or half again as much as usual while the Peace country from BC into Alberta saw too little at around 20-30 percent of normal. Temperatures followed the same pattern with the north right on normals while the southern portions were warmer than normal.

### August Outlook

Near normal temperatures are forecast for August. The three month outlook is for below normal temperatures and precipitation.
